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What you should know prior to your consultation

Options for breast reconstruction – There are two main types of breast reconstruction: implant based and autologous tissue transfer. Implant based reconstruction uses saline or silicone implants to create the shape of the breast. Autologous tissue transfer uses tissue from another part of the body, such as the abdomen, back, or thighs, to create the breast.

Risks and benefits to each type of reconstruction: Both implant-based and autologous tissue transfer have risks and benefits. It is important to discuss these with your surgeon so that you can make an informed decision about which type of reconstruction is right for you.



Recovery time for each type of reconstruction: The recovery time for breast reconstruction varies depending on the type of surgery and your individual circumstances. With all of our reconstructive procedures we use established enhanced recovery after surgery protocols (ERAS). These protocols focus on optimizing patient care before, during, and after surgery to reduce the risk of complications and speed up recovery.

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Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS)

There are a number of advantages to using ERAS protocols following breast reconstruction. These include:

- Shorter hospital stay: Patients who follow ERAS protocols typically have a shorter hospital stay than those who do not. This can save patients time and money, and it can also help them get back to their normal activities sooner.
